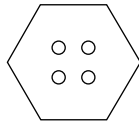
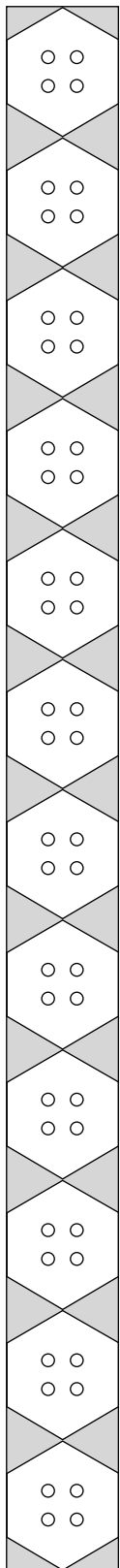
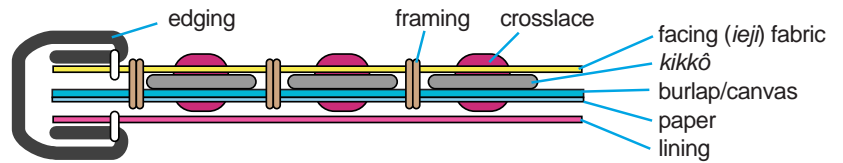


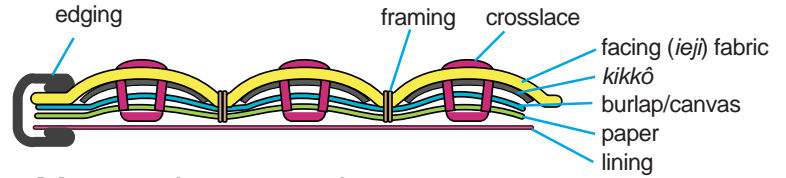
# Patterns for *kikkô*. (Sizes indicated)

## Simple way to make *kikkô*:

1. Cut your *kikkô* material — either steel or plastic — into strips .6" wide.
2. Copy and print the bit on the left, and attach it with a spray adhesive to the strip.
3. Use a drill press (the easiest method owing to the ability to make a jig for standardized hole placement) or drill or punch the holes.
4. Using tin snips or a hobby knife, cut away the individual plates. If using metal, make sure the edges are flat and smooth.
5. If using metal, place each plate in an indented form and smack with a ball-pen hammer to make the concavity. If using plastic, don't bother. You're done.
